John Naland was president of the American Foreign Service Association from 2001-2003 and again from 2007-2009. AFSA is the professional association and union representing 31,000 active and retired Foreign Service employees of the Department of State, the Agency for International Development, the Foreign Agricultural Service, and the Foreign Commercial Service.

A career Foreign Service Officer, he joined the U.S. Department of State in 1986. He has served in Colombia, Costa Rica, and Nicaragua.
