Bill Haugh served in the Foreign Service from 1980 until his retirement April 30, 2015. His last assignment was at the Foreign Service Institute where he was Dean of the School of Language Studies and interim Executive Director.

Mr. Haugh was the Director of the Office of Management Policy, Rightsizing and Innovation (M/PRI) 2011-2012. He was Foreign Policy Advisor (POLAD) to the Chief of Staff of the Army (2009-2011), and Executive Director of the Bureaus

of Near Eastern Affairs and South and Central Asian Affairs from 2007-2009. He was Minister-Counselor for Management in Rome (2003-2007), and Deputy Executive Director and Chief of Human Resources for the Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs (2000-2003). Earlier assignments include Rome, Stockholm, Abidjan, Washington, Baghdad, Tunis, and Halifax.

Mr. Haugh received the Presidential Meritorious Service Award, six Senior Foreign Service Performance Awards, and several Department of State honor awards. His languages are French and Italian.

He graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, and received an MPA from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government. He served in the Army 1973-1980, attaining the rank of Captain.

He is married to Kathryn Sampson. Bill and Kathryn grew up in military families around the world and across the U.S.; they now live in Fairfax, Va. They have two daughters.
