

## Details of the Delta Military/Foreign Service Pet Travel Waiver

Effective March 1, 2016 Delta will only accept the following animals as checked baggage: (1) pets for members of the U.S. military and the U.S. Foreign Service and their dependents with active transfer orders; and (2) service and emotional support animals that comply with federal regulations including proper documentation based on current policies and procedures. All pets or other animals not meeting these exceptions and are not able to travel as checked baggage and will only be accepted for travel as freight through **Delta Cargo.** 

**Please note:** Delta Cargo will only accept international pet shipments from International Pet and Animal Transportation Association members. International customers should visit ipata.org to find an approved member to assist with their transportation requirements.

For customers with flights prior to March 1, 2016: Pets in Hold (AVIH) or traveling with a pet as checked baggage, requires at least a 48 hours advanced notice before departure.

## **Fees**

A <u>one-way fee</u> applies for checking a pet in on a flight. If making a transfer to another airline, be sure to allow time to for your customer to claim and recheck the pet with the connecting airline.

## **Special cases**

For any travel to or from South Africa, Hong Kong or the United Kingdom — with the exception of service animals — pets must travel as cargo and are not permitted as checked baggage.
