Sharon Wayne is currently an active duty member of the Foreign Service. Prior to her election as USAID Vice President of the American Foreign Service Association, Ms. Wayne served as an Assignments and Performance Counselor providing guidance and advocacy for USAID Foreign Service officers.

Previously, Ms. Wayne was Office Director for American Schools and Hospitals Abroad, one of the Agency's oldest programs, providing competitive grants to non-profit universities, secondary schools, libraries and medical centers that exemplify American ideas and practices abroad. She also served as the Regional Supervisory Contracting Officer in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic supporting the Central American Free Trade Agreement, health, education, and democracy programs in the Dominican Republic, Jamaica, Guyana, Barbados as well as non-presence countries in the Eastern Caribbean and surge support to Haiti.

Prior to entering the Foreign Service she served as a Contracting Officer with the Peace Corps assisting evacuated volunteers and providing headquarters administrative support. She has a long history with USAID, serving as a contract specialist in the Regional Economic Development Service Office in Nairobi, Kenya where she supported a wide variety of programs throughout East Africa. She originally joined USAID as an intern in the Office of Acquisition and Assistance in 1987.

Ms. Wayne is the recipient of several Honor Awards including the C. Herbert Rees Memorial Award. She has two teenage children, Angela and Jesse, and currently resides in Annapolis, Md.
